

ACCESS STATEMENT FOR ANGLESEY MODEL VILLAGE

When you arrive at Anglesey Model Village, there is a large car park which also has disabled parking for 4 or 5 cars which is situated near to the window where you pay the entrance fee. The rest of the car park has ample space for a large coach to turn round, provided it is outside of the school holidays (when the car park may be crowded).The car park surface is hard stone with firm grassed areas there is also a bike stand so that cycles can be locked.

On entering the model village the entrance gate is fastened back and the pay window is accessible to people walking or in wheelchairs. If the person in a wheelchair or on a disabled scooter is alone, a member of staff will hold the hinged barrier back which is situated after the pay window. All the paths are on one level and paved or concreted and over one meter wide. There are two separate toilets, one ladies with a baby-changing facility and one men's toilet. There is a concrete ramp up to both toilets, and the doors open outwards with a hand rail inside next to each toilet.

There are two garden benches as you walk round the path, one half way round and the other one three quarters way round so that anyone wishing to rest can do so. At the end of the path is an undercover seating area with separate tables and plastic chairs this is on the same floor level as the path and is the entrance to the tea room. There is a shallow ramp up to the tea room for customers who cannot negotiate the step. The tea room door is fastened open as is the gate to the outside play area. The play area being on the same level as the path and has forest bark covering where the swings and slide are and a firm grassed area where there are four large circular tables and separate plastic chairs. A paved path the same level as the play area forms the exit this being the same width as the entrance. A small hinged gate opens outwards into the car park again a member of staff will be available should anyone need assistance going through the exit gate.

The model village is situated on the A4080 road just outside Newborough village.The no42 bus service travels from Newborough to Bangor and back and the bus driver will usually stop near the model village if asked in advance. A bus timetable is available on request. Well behaved dogs are allowed into the model village on a short lead. Visitors are allowed to bring their own picnic to eat in the play area. The tea room serves tea and coffee, minerals, light snacks and ice cream. Viewing and photography are from the pathways only and our Family Quiz keeps everyone busy.
